his month, the two middle-aged women swapped their security officers' uniforms for graduation gowns as they both graduated in various disciplines within the Faculty of Education.

On 11 May 2016, Sizakele Nkalana (40) graduated with a degree in B.Ed Foundation Phase degree while her colleague Phumzile Dlamini, (47) earned the Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE).

The 40-year-old mother of one has worked at the University of Zululand since January 2008.

"By that time I already had a Travel and Tourism Diploma from a private college. However, after not finding employment in the tourism sector I decided to swallow my pride and enrolled for training as a security officer. After that I landed a job at UNIZULU".

Nkalana says working at an educational institution bolstered her desire to study further. In 2012, she did exactly that and enrolled for the full-time course.

While she managed to finish the degree in three years, she quickly points out that it wasn't as easy as it now seems. "Sometimes I would knock off work at 6am after doing night shift and then I would go straight to class. Some of the times I couldn't attend lecturers because I also had chores to do at home".

Just like her colleague, Dlamini says studying while working full-time was a road fraught with difficulties.

"In some instances I would end up taking a nap in my car while waiting for classes because there was no time to go home and rest after doing the night shift. That car had become everything, there isn't a book you won't find in there, it's more of a library," she said bursting into laughter.

Things got so tough for Dlamini that on many occasions she thought of quitting. However, the love she has for teaching kept her going.

She has had a couple of stints as a substitute teacher, the first one was shortly after she matriculated.

"I have always loved teaching, I think it also has to do with the fact that my mother is a teacher, although she is retired now. So after passing matric in 1995, albeit not having any qualification, I taught at a Primary school for three years".

Domestic worker gets BSc Degree




Graduation hailed a success
